Montezuma Falls

Return distance:	7 km
Walking time:	3-4 hours
Surface:	Gravel
Walk Difficulty:	Easy

Getting There

The walk starts at the Hercules Mine haulage at the former township of Williamsford 8 km south of Rosebery.

The turn off on the Murchison Highway 2 km south of Rosebery is well signposted.



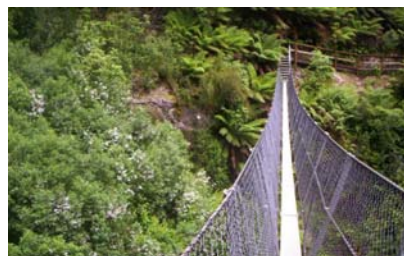
The walk

The walk to Montezuma Falls, Tasmania's highest waterfall, is one of the easiest and most rewarding walks on the West Coast.

It is suitable for both young and old. The track is gently graded and follows an abandoned tramline. It is suitable for walking and mountain bikes.

There is a viewing platform at the foot of the falls which tower over 100 metres above.

A swing bridge spans the gorge to link this track with 4WD access from Melba Flats.



Walking Safety

Before embarking on a walk, please consider the following:

1. Where possible, stay on formed tracks;
2. Only attempt walks within your capabilities, if unsure seek medical and/or professional advice;
3. Never jump or dive into natural waterways;
4. Watch your step, keep away from cliff edges, waterfalls and slippery rocks;
5. Carry a supply of drinking water;
6. Enjoy your walk.
