

West Coast Walks Fact Sheet



Spray Tunnel Loop

A walk that takes you through a spectacular railway tunnel constructed in 1904.



Basic Facts

Nearest town:	Zeehan
Return distance:	4 km
Walking time:	1 hour
Surface:	Gravel
Walk Difficulty:	Easy

Getting There

Travel to the western end of Zeehan onto the road to Granville Harbour, into Fowler Street and out to the Zeehan Golf Club on a well signposted gravel road used regularly by locals including vehicles.

The walk

The loop track begins opposite the Zeehan Golf Club. There is a small car park just past the Golf Club.

The walk passes through the Spray Tunnel, a 100 metre long abandoned train tunnel that leads to the abandoned Spray Silver Mine.

From the Spray Silver Mine it goes right returning to the Golf Club and Zeehan.

Walking Safety

Before embarking on a walk, please consider the following:

1. Where possible, stay on formed tracks;
2. Only attempt walks within your capabilities, if unsure seek medical and/or professional advice;
3. Never jump or dive into natural waterways;
4. Watch your step, keep away from cliff edges, waterfalls and slippery rocks;
5. Carry a supply of drinking water;
6. Enjoy your walk.
